VISITING POLICY

Visits to our patients during their inpatient stay are possible under the following conditions:

- > Immunity due to full COVID-19 vaccination or convalescent status (proof).
- > Children and young people under the age of 18 are only admitted as visitors in exceptional, case-by-case situations.
The assessment of the exceptional case is carried out by the treating doctors.
- > You will receive a visitor pass at the entrance, which you must return after your stay. This must be carried during the stay and presented on request.
- > Please bring a valid same-day rapid antigen test (for the date of visit) and present it at the entrance.
- > Maximum one visitor per day/per patient – max. one hour.
- > Accompanying persons of impaired visitors can accompany them to the patient's room.

VISITING HOURS REHAB: daily from 10 to 12 noon and from 1 to 6 p.m.

With compulsory appointment via the Visitor Service.

Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. From Friday afternoon onwards, and on weekends and public holidays, the Visitor Service is not staffed.

VISITING TIMES ACUTE:

daily from 10.30 to 12 noon and from 3 to 5 p.m. No appointments, but registration at the main entrance is compulsory.

We would like to point out that visits must be interrupted in the event of urgent examinations.

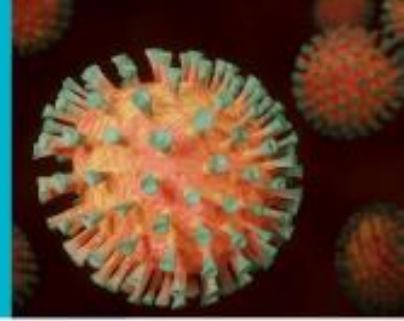
Please note:

- > Under no circumstances should you enter the hospital if you have acute respiratory illnesses (e.g. cough or cold) and/or an elevated body temperature or have been in an area of variants of concern according to the current RKI definition in the last 14 days. https://www.rki.de/DE/Content/InfAZ/N/Neuartiges_Coronavirus/Risikogebiete_neu.html
- > **Disinfect your hands** when entering and leaving the hospital and the patient's room.
- > Keep a distance of 1.5 metres from strangers.
- > An **FFP2 mask must always** be worn in all parts of the building at all times.
- > **The instructions** of the clinic staff must be followed.

VISITING POLICY CLINIC FOR NEUROPAEDIATRICS

Visits to the Clinic for Neuropaediatrics are only possible after **prior e-mail registration!** Please send your visit requests, whether in the outside area (hospital grounds outside) or in the inside area (ward in patient room), exclusively by e-mail to MTKPaediatriebesuch@vkkd-kliniken.de.

Registrations are only possible from Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. You will receive feedback on the appointment, which will be noted in the patient's therapy plan. This allows us to track which people were in the children's hospital or had contact with our patients outside, and at what times.

Visits to the ward in the patient's room:

In principle, visitation is permitted during the week and at weekends for one hour daily for only one person in the patient's room. Siblings (with a current AG test) can be brought along only in exceptional cases and only after prior consultation with the attending doctor.

Children staying in the double room either meet alone with the visitor in the room or are assigned a place to meet by the nursing staff.

The following applies to the outdoor appointments (clinic grounds):

Visits are only possible by one person with an appointment once a day for one to two hours on the clinic premises. Please enter the clinic via the main entrance and report to reception.

If you come from a high-incidence area according to the current RKI definition or have spent a holiday there, please refrain from visiting the neuropaediatric department within the next 14 days after your return.

The 2G plus rule applies to all from 22.11.2021:

- Fully vaccinated, from the 15th day after the 2nd vaccination with a vaccine approved in the EU (with proof!)
- Those who have already recovered from a SARS-CoV-2 infection, if the infection or the positive SARS-CoV-2 detection was not less than 28 days and not more than three months ago (with proof!)
- Those recovered from a SARS-CoV-2 infection from day 15 after vaccination with a vaccine approved in the EU (with proof)
- **For all visits: From now on, please bring a daily updated AG test to the visit appointment and report with it at the main entrance.**
- **Visitor pass: From now on, all visitors will receive a visitor pass at the entrance. This must be presented on request.**
- Non-vaccinated persons can be given visiting appointments **only in exceptional cases** after prior consultation with the responsible specialist!

The same applies to all visiting appointments, whether outdoors or indoors on the ward:

be sure to wear an FFP2 mask! Please also be sure to bring an official photo document (e.g. identity card).
